


Interviews with 1,028 adult Americans conducted by telephone by Opinion Research Corporation on October 6-8, 2006. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points and for results based on half-samples is plus or minus 4.5 percentage points. The sample included 920 registered voters (plus or minus 3 percentage points) and 543 likely voters (plus or minus 4 percentage points).




5. Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is handling its job?


