

## Conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center

Interviews with 339 New Hampshire residents who say they plan to vote in the Democratic presidential primary and 306 who say they plan to vote in the Republican presidential primary, conducted by telephone on March 27-April 3, 2007. The margin of sampling error is plus or minus 5.5 percentage points.
