

Conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center

Interviews with 613 adults in New Hampshire conducted by telephone on June 6-11, 2007, including 304 who say they plan to vote in the Republican presidential primary and 309 who say they plan to vote in the Democratic presidential primary. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 4 percentage points. For Democratic and Republican primary voters, it is plus or minus 5.5 percentage points.
