



Interviews with 1,029 adult Americans, including 907 registered voters, 450 registered voters who described themselves as Democrats or Independents who lean Democratic, and 383 registered voters who describe themselves as Republicans or Independents who lean Republican conducted by telephone by Opinion Research Corporation on June 22-24, 2007. The margin of sampling error for results based on the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points; for registered voter sit is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points; for emocrats it is plus or minus 4.5 percentage points and for Republicans it is plus or minus 5 percentage points.
