

# **FLORIDA POLL**

Interviews with 1,099 adults in Florida conducted by telephone by Opinion Research Corporation on November 25-26, 2007, including 300 voters who say they are likely to vote in the Florida Republican presidential primary and 357 who say they are likely to vote in the Florida Democratic presidential primary. The margin of sampling error is plus or minus three percentage points for all respondents.
